Site 12 contains 51.2 acres within the larger industrial park. Design plans are not yet known, pending sale to a manufacturing company, but it is anticipated that utilities and a building (or buildings) will be constructed. Utilities are currently available to the site.

Enclosed is a request for consultation regarding a Section 106 review of the impact of future development of a tract in the Partnership Industrial Center in Springfield, owned by the Springfield Business Development Corporation, a partnership between the City, City Utilities, and Chamber of Commerce. The reason for the review is that the site is proposed for inclusion in the Missouri Certified Sites Program administered by the Missouri Department of Economic Development.

The setting is a rural area on the fringe of Springfield that has traditionally used for farming and pasture. The Springfield-Branson National Airport is located just north of the site known as "Site 12" and has influenced the land use for the past several years, including establishment of the industrial center. In fact, the airport commissioned a Cultural Resources Survey in 2000 in order to assess the cultural resources near a proposed radar facility known as an "ASR 11." This equipment is located just across Highway EE (Division Street) from Site 12. For this reason, the survey was relied on for our determination of "No Adverse Impact on Historic Properties." This determination was made by the SMSU Center for Archeological Research but unfortunately, SHPO did not comment within the 30 days provided so we do not know if SHPO concurred (see attached SHPO letter dated June 26, 2000). Although this report was done for a different purpose than assessing Site 12, we assumed that they would have provided information if there was reason to believe there were important cultural resources on Site 12 since it is just across the street.

We are also sending this request for consultation to Chief Jim Gray and Dr. Andrea A. Hunter of the Osage Nation Tribe since they have indicated an interest in proposals for developing previously undisturbed land.
